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
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Introduction

This book includes abstracts of the Dearborn County, Indiana Commissioners' Records Book 3, covering January 1840 to September 1845.

The County Commissioners handled business relevant to the county roads, the county poor, county taxes, jury selection retail and liquor licenses, and much more. All names within the record book are included in the abstracts. An every name index is included at the back of the book.

Retail licenses may have included foreign and domestic merchandise, groceries, or liquors. Tavern licenses typically also included a liquor license.



Indiana's Gore

Indiana's "Gore" is a triangle of land in the southeastern corner of Indiana. The area is bounded by the Ohio River to the south, the Indiana-Ohio border to the east, and the Greenville Treaty line to the west. This part of Indiana stayed part of the Northwest Territory after Indiana Territory was formed and joined Indiana Territory only after Ohio became a state. It contains the present-day Indiana counties of Dearborn, Franklin, Ohio, Randolph, Switzerland, Union and Wayne.
