INTRODUCTION

This newsletter is initiated to promote the exchange of information among researchers concerned with Creswell families. It will serve its purpose if it is of interest and/or essistance to Creswell descendants and if it helps to prevent duplication of research efforts. The primary objective is the accumulation of enough family information to justify the compilation and publication of a comprehensive genealogy of the Creswell family of America. Readers are encouraged to submit their research findings (properly supported by sources of information) for inclusion in future issues.

SPELLING OF THE SURNAME

Creswell family research is complicated by the number of variant misspellings involved. In the 17th and 18th centuries in both Britain and America the preferred spellings were "Cresswell" and "Creswell." "Criswell" was an American innovation which became popular in the early 19th century. Examination of original manuscript autographs shows almost all American Creswells used one of these three spellings. Clerks, scriveners, and archives transcribers, however, exercised considerable ingenuity and originality in spelling this surname. Some of the common misspellings are: Carswell, Christwell, Chriswell, Cristwell, Crestwell, Craswell, Cristwell, Crestwell, Craswell, Crestwell, Crestwell, Cristwell, Crestwell, Craswell, Creswell, Criswell of Chagrin Falis, Ohio, reports that his letters often come addressed to Mr. Kisswell or Mr. Cusswell. Problem spellings are "Caswell" and "Crosswell", both actual names often confused as "Creswell." For the purposes of this newsletter, "Creswell" will be used generally.

BIBLIOGRAPHY

It appears that there has never been published any Creswell genealogy. Typed genealogies of several branches of the family have been distributed to limited audiences. A small number of biographical sketches have appeared in local historical and biographical publications popular in the 1880's and 1890's. In this column are described sources of Creswell family information available in libraries. Readers knowing of additional items are requested to contribute pertinent information (and copies, if available) to the editor.

A TORY CRESWELL

In his pension application, HENRY CRESWELL (b. 1759) of Sumpter District, York co., S. C., stated that during his last tour of duty in 1782 he guarded Tory prisoners at Orangeburg, S.C., and captured and exported two of his uncles as Tories, for which acts he was offered and refused a reward for bravery and was breveted to the command of his company. (National Archives, Revolutionary Pension Claims, S-3232) Loyalist WILLIAM CRESSWELL was granted 250 acres on Windsor Road, Halifax co., Nova Scotia, in 1784. (Gilroy, Loyalists and Land Settlements in Nova Scotia, 1957, p.45) One wonders if this William Cresswell could be an uncle of Henry of South Carolina and Wilson co., Tenn. Has any reader found records of other Loyalist Creswells?

THE GOOD OLD DAYS

JOHN B. CRISWELL (b. 1838), school teacher at Canton twp., Stark co., Ohio, "a tall, raw-boned man who prided himself on his ability to govern a school," was barred out of the school by his students because he refused to give them whis-

ky. He tried to break into the school through the roof and the chimney and finally battered in the door. He "soon lost his influence for good in that community," and joined his father-in-law Jacob Dager in the sheep business. (Danner, Canton and Stark County Landmarks, p.24; Perrin, Stark County History, p.298)

CRESWELL WILLS

For mid-Atlantic and southern states, wills are the most fruitful source of genealogical information, especially if including an account of distribution to the heirs. His father was killed by the Shawnees and his mother left with eight children. In his 16th year he joined a company raised to protect the infant settlements on the Clinch River. He served in the Revolutionary War and was at King's Mountain and Guilford Courthouse. He removed to Boyd's Creek in 1787; served in the Indian Wars; was one of the founders of Eusebia Church."

RESEARCH REPORT FROM ULSTER

Our genealogist in Northern Ireland has completed the initial screening of basic Irish genealogical source materials. Findings and the lack of certain findings indicate that the Cresswells were never numerous in Ireland but were most numerous in the period 1700-1750. The early 18th century family center appears to have been in the parish of Hollywood a few miles northeast of Belfast on Belfast Lough in County Down. The family was clearly not among the landed and pedigreed gentry.

Previous research was commissioned in 1932 by the late Robert Bruce Criswell of Columbus, Ohio, who retained the great Irish genealogist Tenison Groves to seek the family origin in Ulster. DOES ANY READER KNOW THE PRESENT WHEREABOUTS OF ROBERT B. CRISWELL'S GENEALOGICAL COLLECTION? If it can not be found, we will have to ask for the tedious copying of the Groves Collection at the Public Records Office at Belfast.

The first report from Ulster deals with indexed Creswell probate records. It is interesting to note that the preferred spelling "Carswell" is the same as that of all the Criswell-Creswell families listed in the 1790 Federal Census of Chester and Huntingdon counties, Pennsylvania. Two generous contributions have raised the fund to a total of \$84, on which \$20 has been expended and \$20 more advanced, leaving a balance of \$44. We have requested abstracts of additional Creswell probate records and of deeds. Unfortunately, the Hollywood parish register is not extant. Each contributor to the research fund received detailed copies of the research reports from Ireland.

CRESWELL ARMORTAL BEARINGS

According to the Committee on Heraldry of the New England Historic Genealogical Society and the National Better Business Bureau, "the right to bear a particular coat of arms can be proved only by a grant from a body authorized to grant arms, by descent from such a grantee, or by descent from some individual whose right to the arms in question can be shown by such evidence as inclusion in one of the Visitations conducted by officers of the College of Arms between 1528/9 and 1686." It is with the above facts in mind that we provide the following descriptions of Cresswell coats of arms.

Cresswell of Cresswell, Northumberland.Arms: "Gules, three plates each charged with a squirrel cracking a nut of the field." Recorded to GEORGE CRESSWELL at the Visitation of the Court of York in 1584 and officially entered at the College of Arms at that time.

Creswell of Purston, Northampton. Arms: "Azure, three plates each charged with a squirrel Gules devouring an acorn Or." Crest: "A branch of an oak-tree barwise, a bough at each end Vert fructed Or, between them a squirrel Gules devouring an acorn of the second." Granted to ROBERT CRESWELL of Purston, son and heir of JOHN CRESWELL, by William Dethick, Garter, 20 February 1590, and recorded at the Visitation of Northampton-shire 1618-1619.

NECROLOGY

PUBLICATION OF A CRESWELL GENEALOGY

Several readers have inquired about our plans for publication of the Creswell genealogy. As reported on page 13, considerable progress is being made in accumulating information about various individuals and branches of the family in America. Considerable research, however, remains to be accomplished. Our objectives are as follows: (1) to identify the Northern Iraland and previous English origins of the earliest American Creswell colonists, (2) to fully document the lives of the 18th century American Creswell men, (3) to identify the parents of most of the Creswell colonials, and (4) to obtain basic family information about the majority of the 19th century Creswells. This newsletter will be used for making primary historical and family records available and to promote the collection and exchange of information.

CRESWELL CENSUS PROJECT

A professional archives abstractor was recently employed to seek out all Creswells enumerated in the United States census of 1800, 1810, 1820, 1830, 1840, and 1850. Reports will be published as they are received.

ANDREW CRESWELL FAMILY BIBLE RECORD

Contributed by John Olin Creswell, Knoxville, Tenn.

Published by Matthew Carey, 122 Market St., Philadelphia, Pa., 1811. Entries prior to 1838 are said to be in the handwriting of Andrew² Creswell, who must have transcribed pre-1811 entries from an earlier family register. The Bible is now in the possession of Margaret Virginia⁶ (Pitner) Layman, 3705 Essary Dr., Knoxville, Tenn. She received it from her father Dan Randolph⁵ Pitner of Seymour, Tenn. (died 21 Oct. 1929), who is said to have received it from Margaret Virginia³ (Creswell) Snoddy, who probably received it from her brother Samuel E. Creswell. The editor has rearranged entries in genealogical order. The following transcript is limited to the first three generations of Andrew's descendants.

PARENTAGE OF ANDREW CRESWELL

While not proven, the parentage of Andrew² Creswell of eastern Tennessee is fairly well established by the facts provided by: (1) his obituary (see page 9), (2) his pension claim (see page 8), (3) his record (above) of the death of his presumed mother Rebecca¹ Creswell, (4) Abingdon, Virginia, records, and (5) Augusta County, Va., records. Briefly, these sources indicate that one HENRY¹ CRESWELL, found in Augusta County re-

cords 1745-1772, and in Abingdon, Fincastle (now Washington) County records 1773-1776, was the father of Andrew Creswell. Henry is known to have had wife REBECCA in 1767 and to have been killed in a fight with British Indian allies in July 1776 near Abingdon. While it is possible that - as indicated by Andrew's obituary - his parents may have sojourned in South Carolina, they have not yet been found mentioned in South Carolina records and are fairly well accounted for in Virginia. To fully document Henry's life, research in Orange and Botetourt Counties, Virginia, must be undertaken. Though the names of Henry's associates suggest that he originated with the Ulster Creswells first found in Chester County, Pa., in 1722, no evidence has yet been found to indicate his parentage. It is presumed, however, that he was a brother of ANDREW1 CRESWELL who moved from Augusta County to South Carolina before 1758. Note that - later historians notwithstanding - there is no contemporary evidence that Henry was ever known as "William Henry Creswell." -- G.E.R.

Only a few highlights from the latest research report can be included in this number because of space limitations. Contributors to the Research Fund received copies of the complete report. Three more contributions raised the fund total to \$107, of which \$60 has been expended for research in Ireland, leaving a \$47 balance unexpended. The genealogist is still working on Belfast sources at the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. He reports that very few 18th century gravestone inscriptions are still legible.

Executors Dr. Samuel Marshall and Leroy Watson. Witnesses: George Marshall, Joseph and Wm. Eakins. Godicil named Ira Griffin executor in place of Leroy Watson; six children to share in slaves and livestock; witnesses: Richard Griffin, Larkin Gaines, and James S. Turnbull. 

"FIGHTER" HENRY CRESWELL (1759-1843)

Thanks to the researches of a number of Creswell descendants, we now have an excellent record of Captain Henry Creswell of York Co., S. C., and Wilson co., Tenm., Revolutionary soldier and pensioner. See pages 24-26 for York county records of him. Like his presumed uncle Henry Creswell (c1720-1776) of Augusta and Washington counties, Va. [see Chalkley's abstracts of Augusta county court records, I:64], he was apparently a fighting man. He served in the Revolutionary War (see page 24), was acquited 1787 after being charged with fighting (see page 25), and - thanks to Mrs. Whatley's search in the cellar of the York County court house - we now have the following brief account of another episode.

"Pinckney District. Entered ... 30 Nov. 1799. James Little vs Henry Creswell. Henry Creswell attached to answer to James Little a plea of trespass. At Yorkville with force and arms in the District [Pinckney] ... made an assault upon him [Little] and did beat, wound, and ill treat so that his life was greatly dispaired of and other wrongs ... suit for \$1000. Therefore it is so ordered that the said Little do recover against the said Creswell £3 and also \$27.84. Judgment signed 27 Jan. 1301." [Box 1, folder 9, York County Court Records.]

For the vital recordless southern and central states, tax lists can be of great help in locating early families, tracing their migrations, and establishing land ownership. The following compilation was initiated by Ezra E. Macy who generously provided an abstract of the Pennsylvania tax lists from the published Pennsylvania Archives, Third Series. To these the editor has added lists from other sources and arranged all in alphabetical, chronological, and geographical order. It should be understood that these represent only a small proportion of the total number of tax lists, most of which are hidden away in county and state archives. To conserve space we have excluded information such as numbers of livestock owned, amount of tax, and manuscript or published source of the data.

EAST TENNESSEE FAMILY REUNION

Repeating last year's successful family reunion (reported on page 12), 126 Creswell descendants attended the 15 August 1965 reunion of Knox and Sevier County families at Knoxville. Pledges are being made for funds to publish J. Olin Creswell's genealogy of the descendants of Samuel E³ Creswell (1792-1859) and wife Mary Fagala Creswell of Boyd's Creek, Sevier County, Tenn. (Andrew², Henry¹)

EAST TENNESSEE CRESVELL RECORDS

Contributed by J. Olin Creswell

In 1788 JAMES CRESSWELL received two North Carolina land grants in Tennessee: #2134 for 50 acres on the south side of the Holston River in [what was then] Greene County; and #2565 for 1000 acres on both sides of the west fork of Turkey Creek in [what was then] Hawkins County. [Cartwright & Gardiner, North Carolina Land Grants in Tennessee, 1778-1791, 1958, pages 45 and 54]

In 1786 Adam F. Meek made a map of the Strawberry Plains Farm on the south side of the Holston River at the point where Creswell's Mill Creek joins the Holston at the present corner of Knox, Jefferson, and Sevier counties. Included in Meek's table showing "Acres of Original Entries" were: "The Cruswell Tract [of] 606 acres" and "Cruswells 50 acre entry [of] 54 acres".

Knox and Jefferson counties were established in 1792 from portions of Greene and Hawkins counties.

By deeds dated 7 Nov. 1793, JAMES CRESWELL bought from Stockley Donaldson et al, 1200 acres and 600 acres on Bluff Creek in Knox County. [Knox County Deeds, AI:514,516] By deed dated 4 Jan. 1794, JAMES CRESWELL by his attorney AN-DREW CRESWELL sold to John Galbreath for £300, 1000 acres below Creswell Creek on the South Holston River in Knox County. [Ibid., ICI:273]

NOTE: This association with Andrew enables us to identify James as a probable brother of Andrew (see pages 22-24) from Washington County, Va., where James Kerswell was a juror in 1778 and administator of James Laird estate 22 Nov. 1781. He was among appraisors of the Benjamin Estill estate 17 April 1782 and a grand juror 19 Nov. 1782. [Summers, History of Southwest Virginia, 1124] (See pages 77 and 78 for Washington County tax listings for James in the period 1782-1786.)

By deed dated 17 June 1794, ANDREW CRESWELL of Knox County, attorney in fact for JAMES CRESWELL, late of Jefferson County, sold to Hugh Gilbreath of Jefferson County for £75, 400 acres in Jefferson County on the south side of the Holston River. Adam Meek was a witness. [Jefferson County Deeds, B:1314]

NOTE: The above deed indicates that by 1794 James had moved away from Greswell's Creek at Strawberry Plains. An Augusta County, Va., Court Judgment in August 1794, case of Gibson vs. Elliot, mentioned that "James Creswell lives on the French Broad, 24 May 1794." This would place him possibly in present Sevier County in which both Dumplin and Boyd's Creeks join the French Broad River, or further west in present western Knox County where Turkey Creek joins to Tennessee (combined Holston and French Broad) River.

By deed dated 5 Feb. 1794, ANDREW CRESWELL, attorney in fact for JAMES CRESWELL of Jefferson County, sold to Stokely Donaldson of Hawkins County for £50, 50 acres in Jefferson County... "corner to the said survey the said Creswell lives on, thence up the river... to a stake on Creswell's old line." [Jefferson County Deeds, B:312] NOTE: This deed, out of chronological sequence, indicates that James left Jefferson County between February and June 1794.

By deed dated 10 April 1799 JAMES CRESWELL by his attorney ANDREW CRESWELL sold to Adam Meek 500 acres below Creswell Creek on the South Holston River in Knox County. [Knox County Deeds, IG:80]

By deed dated 11 Nov. 1802 JAMES CRESWELL through his attorney ANDREW CRESWELL sold to James Cozley 1200 acres on Bluff Creek in Knox County. [Ibid., AI:518]

By deed dated 10 Jan. 1805, JAMES CRESWELL through his attorney ANDREW CRESWELL sold to Samuel Todd 120 acres on the south side of the Holston River in Knox County. [Knox County Deeds, MI:226]

This James may be identical with the JAMES CRISWELL for whom a marriage bond was issued in Augusta County, Va., 13 Dec. 1794, for his marriage to PEGGY Cargo, with Jacob Kinney as surety. JAMES CHRISWELL and MARY Carge [sic] were married in Augusta Gounty by the Rev. John McCue 24 Dec. 1794. [Chalkley, Augusta County Records, II:310,354] That Mary "Peggy" Cargo was then a widow is established by the will of Alexander Gibson dated 13 July 1804, proved in Augusta County Circuit Court 3 Sept. 1804, which named sister Christiana Gibson; sister Mary, wife of Henry Mowry; sister MARGARET, wife of JAMES CRESWELL, and her daughter Elizabeth Cargo; neice Elizabeth Cargo and nephew Samuel Alexander Cargo; nephew Daniel Gibson; and neice HARRIET CRESWELL, daughter of MARGARET. [Ibid., III:250]

Further research is necessary to determine the later history and descendants of James Creswell who left his mill at Creswell's Creek in Strawberry Plains in 1794, at which time he must have been at least 37 years old, having been born c1757 or slightly earlier (according to 1778 jury list). We do find a James Creswell who was a miller at Red Creek in Adams County, Ohio, 1799-1800. [Evans & Stivers, Adams County History, 1900, pages 58,119,149,459] Two different James Criswell's were heads of families in Adams County in 1820. (see page 12)

HENRY CRESWELL married SARAH Copeland 4 April 1797 in East Tennessee County, North Carolina [now, of course, in Tennessee].

By deed dated 10 Oct. 1805 Edward Seaborn of Jefferson County sold to HENRY CRESWELL of Jefferson County for \$333, 100 acres on the waters of Dumplin Creek in Jefferson County [present Sevier County]. [Jefferson County Deeds, G:201] Henry later sold this land to I. Kimbrough. [Ibid., LJ:218]

This Henry is presumed to be identical with the Henry Creswell who wrote from Bedford County, Tenn., 10 July 1836, to one of his Sevier or Blount county relatives that "I was 16 in August before Washington took Wallas ... I will soon be 70." He also stated that [his presumed brother Andrew - see page 23] Andrew Creswell had a sister Polly Huffaker and a sister Ann Evans. This letter would place Henry as being born in August 1766, as Cornwallis surrended at Yorktown in 1781. Another letter from Henry was dated at Farmington, Marshall County, Tenn., 1837, and asked if Andrew was still living.

HENRY CRESWELL died before 1857 when his unmarried daughter REBECCA H. CRESWELL bequeathed her property, including her share in their father's estate, to her sister MARY ANN CRESWELL. Her will was witnessed by ANDREW CRESWELL. On 21 Feb. 1861, ELIZABETH CRESWELL Ashmore of Conway County, Ark., gave power of attorney to her sister MARY ANN CRESWELL to receive her share in the estate of their father HENRY CRESWELL of Marshall County, Tenn. [Marshall County Records, T:513]

By will dated 12 Dec. 1833 (proved Oct. 1834, Knox County), JOSEPH CRESWELL bequeathed all his property to his wife MAR-GARET, and at her death to be equally divided between daughters JANE and MARTHA CRESWELL, who shall pay one dollar to son JOS-EPH CRESWELL and also one dollar each to daughters ELIZABETH and MARY CRESWELL. Witnessed by John Minge and Elizabeth Johnson. James Coker named executor. [Knox County Estates, V:319]

JOSEPH CRISWELL was head of family in Knox County, Tenn., in 1830, he and wife age 80-89, with daughter age 40-49, and daughter age 30-39.

JOURNAL OF NICHOLAS CRESSWELL, 1774-1777

Published in 1924, the journal describes the American travels, primarily in Virginia and Kentucky, of a young Englishman. The four-volume manuscript is owned by Colonial Williamsburg. Gresswell was born at Crowden-le-Booth, Edale parish, Derbyshire in December 1750, son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Oliver) Cresswell. His descent is traced from the Cresswells of Northumberland. He mentioned no American relatives in his journal and failed to hide his contempt for the American patriots and their "foolish frolics".







We hope that this publication has served its intended purpose by encouraging the collection and dissemination of early documentary records of the families. Much research remains to be accomplished; we have merely scratched the surface. There is a special need for research in the county archives of North and South Carolina during the colonial period.

The writer will continue to accumulate and compile records of the early American Creswells and will welcome contributions and correspondence pertaining to Creswells before 1850. We are particularly interested in encouraging compilation and publication of genealogies of specific branches of the family, and will assist in any way possible, especially in affording review and editorial advice.

In closing, we acknowledge the support and assistance generously provided by the many contributors to this effort. With their encouragement and help, we have made a giant step forward in our knowledge of the early Creswell and Criswell families of America and Ireland.

Our only regret is that - in spite of the concerted efforts of a number of researchers - we were unable to solve all the lineage problems, to fully clarify relationships among the colonists, and to identify the British origins or parentage of the first American Creswells.
