After fifty-two years of searching and making memoranda of my findings I feel that the time has now arrived when I should put this accumulated data in readable and understandable form in order that the object aimed at and the result of my efforts shall not be lost to posterity.

I have used what I consider the best approved system for recording, and a very little study will enable any one to understand it. If other members of the older generations, in the years gone by, had made records we of this day would have known much more of them and would not need to spend a lifetime hunting for "scraps of knowledge." I therefore sincerely trust that my efforts will aid and give pleasure to those who succeed us.

Errors will creep in, but I have done my best to avoid them and to keep the record as clean and clear as I possibly could.

From now on I shall continue my search for additional records of the early days and expect from time to time, health and strength permitting, to send you addenda sheets to be incorporated with this record, hereafter leaving it for you to carry on your own record as you please.

I have included a map of the territory in Fulton County, New York, extending about seven miles around the farm on which Elijah and Sally (Sherwin) Porter settled in 1800. Having myself been born on that farm and lived upon it for nearly twenty years, I was able to make this map and locate many of the people who lived there for the first eighty-five years of the last century, mostly about fifty years ago.

I wish to express my sincere thanks to all who have so generously aided me and I hope they have shared with me the pleasure in doing this work, which is not unmixed with duty to my family and their friends.

Now that I have accomplished what I set out to do so long ago, I can not help but feel a certain sense of relief in having it in shape for you, and in having performed my duty as I saw it and to the best of my ability.

THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN PORTER OF PITTSTOWN RENSSELAER CO. N.Y.

---

1. John 1 Porter, b. Nov. 25, 1732, m. abt 1754, Ruth, dau of Ebenezer 3 (Thomas 2, Thomas 1 of Springfield, Mass.) and Mehitable (Moore) Merrick. This marriage took place probably at Oblong (now Quaker Hill) Dutchess Co. N.Y., as Ebenezer after marrying Mehitable Moore of Northfield, Mass., in 1725, settled at Canaan, Conn., and was at Palmer, Mass. for some years, moved to the Oblong in New York. The Merrick Family Record says that their dau Ruth married J. Porter of Oblong, but does not say where. Later they went to Cazenova, Madison Co. N.Y., where they both died. Ruth was b. July 14, 1736.

John 1 and Ruth (Merrick) Porter lived for probably twenty years in Dutchess Co. and most, if not all of their eleven children were born there. Some time prior to 1780 the family moved north into what was then a part of Albany Co. and settled in Pittstown (now in Rensselaer Co.) at a time when there seemed to have been many families doing the same thing.

We find them there when the first Census was taken in 1790. The family then consisted of 2 males over 16 yrs, 3 males 16 yrs and under, and 2 females. They both died in Pittstown.

3. Felix 2 Porter, (son of John 1 and Ruth (Merrick) Porter) b. Apr. 25, 1757, in Dutchess Co. N.Y., according to Revolutionary Records. Went north with the family previous to the war as he served in an Albany Co. Company of troops and when out of the service remained in Pittstown, as we find him the head of a small family in 1790. His wife was Hannah Terrell and they later, about 1798 or 9 moved to Northampton, in Fulton Co., where he died Oct. 1, 1830. D.A.R. Nos. 75118, 88655 and 88656 refer to him as their ancestor.

Mch. 19, 1761, is the only one of John 1 family not accounted for in the 1790 census and is probably the John shown in the adjoining town of Schaghticoke, as the head of a small family. He like his brothers 6, 10 and 12 went to Fulton Co. about the same time as Felix 3.

Jan. 28, 1781, at Rindge, N.H., (See John Sherwin in History of Rindge p688) and settled the same year on a farm in the town of Mayfield, Fulton Co., N.Y., about two miles southwest of the village of Mayfield. The second place west of John Wilkins corners on the Phelps Street road. Sally (Sherwin) Porter died there Aug. 11, 1850 and Elijah the following Apr. 25, 1851. Both were buried in the old Cemetery on Fremont St. in Gloversville, and later moved to the new one on Prospect Hill.

Her mother died there about 1833 and then she went to live with relatives in Johnstown (at the Sir William Johnson mansion) and also in Gloversville where she went to school in the old School House at Main and Fulton Sts. Also on Phelps Street near the School House. At the time of her marriage she was with the Elijah Easterly family north of the Parsons farm. Elias K. 3 was a farmer and carpenter and spent his entire life on the farm of his birth and was buried on Prospect Hill in the same lot with his father and mother. The Family without doubt went to Oblong, N.Y. and lived there for some time as three of the girls married there and Hannah Fuller was also of that place. The date of Ruth's birth was a blank until I inserted the date that I took from Grandfather Elijah's old Bible in 1885 and also found in a letter written by my father's sister in 1863.

The History of Reading by Gilbert A. Davis 1874 pg 140 says "Wm. Kile from Plainsfield, N.H., in 1788 married a dau of John Sherwin:- Mrs. R.W. Hoadley and Mrs. Nancy Caldwell are their daughters." On pg. 153 "John Sherwin who sold to one Garey the Paul Stearns homestead died in town, and his widow died at Felchville. Mrs. R.W. Hoadley her grand-daughter is still residing there."

NOTE:- The compiler of the GOULD GENEALOGY questions the records as to the fact that this Mary was the one that was married to John Sherwin. This writer feels that in the face of seemingly positive records at hand, that there is a very serious question. Topsfield, Births, says Mary Gould b. 6/25, 1741, and Christ Church record says bap. 5/23, 1742, and I have a copy from Elijah Porter's Bible, made in 1868, that says b. June 25, 1741. Both Topsfield and Boxford records say she m. John Sherwin Nov. 8, 1764, and the birth of the first dau. Ruth Oct. 2, 1765 agrees with the Bible record made forty years later by Elijah. She went to Rindge, N.H., and to Reading, Vt., and died at Felchville near Reading. I hope to some day clear this record.

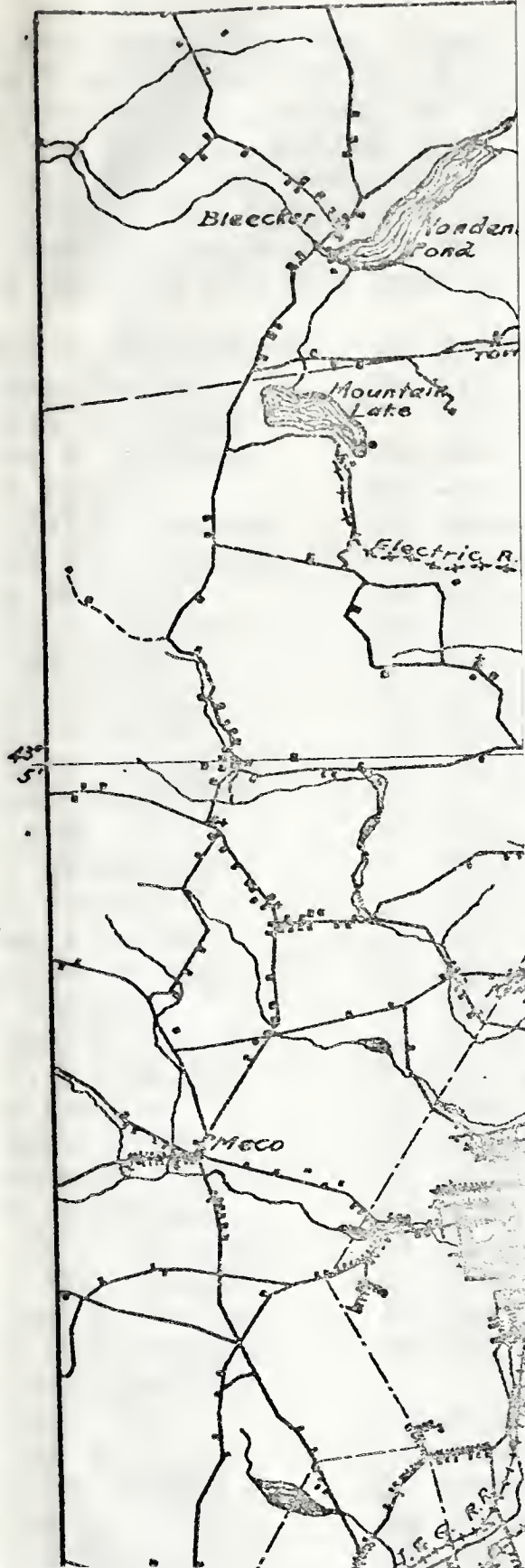

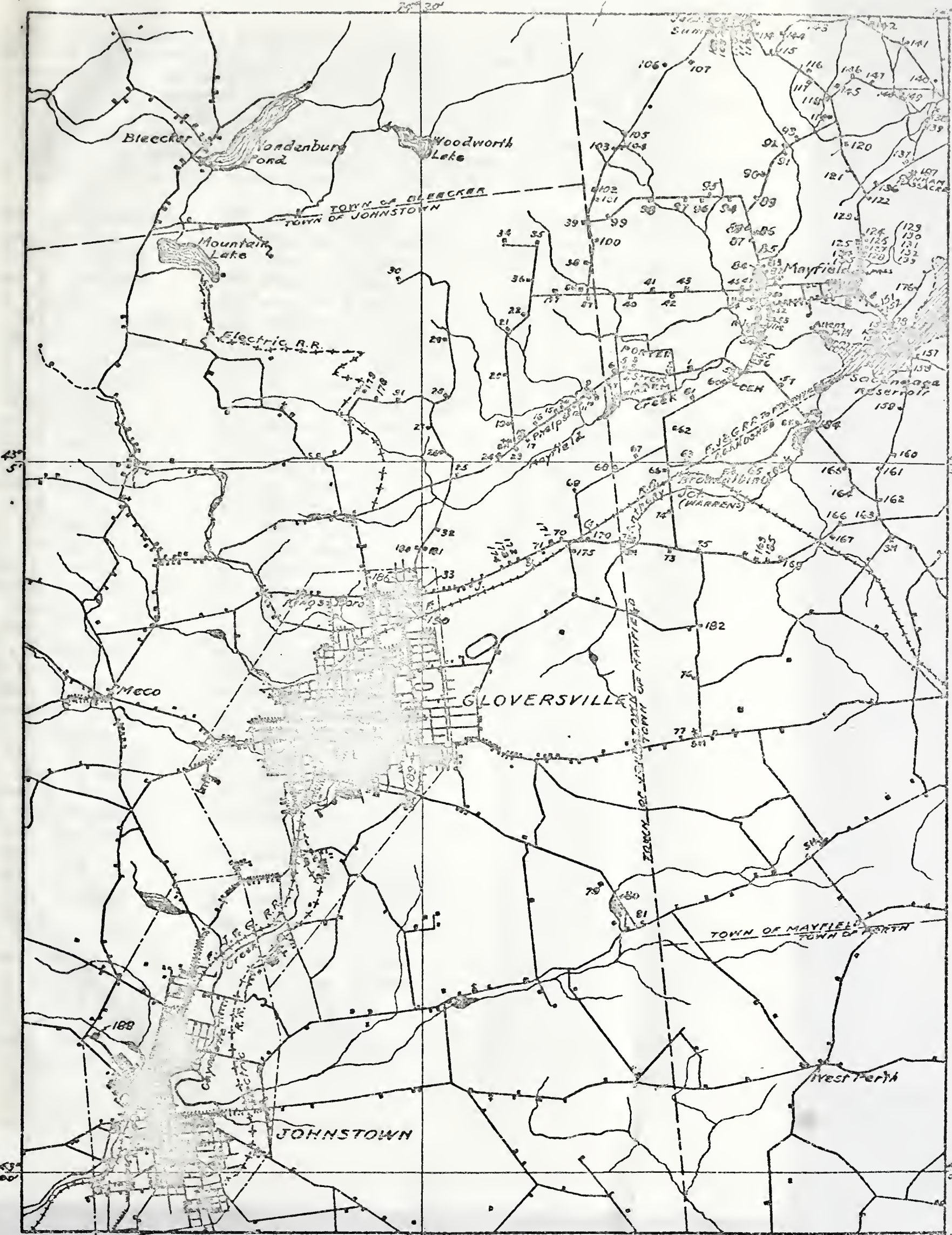
